HORSE MANAGEMENT EXPECTATIONS: The candidate is a beginning-level horse manager, willing to learn the simple routine necessary for safe handling of quiet, well-trained horses. His or her knowledge will vary widely depending on age, educational level, and experience. PRESENTATION/TURNOUT AND TACK RIGHER is to be in safe and neat attire, in accordance with the Standards of Proficiency (SOP). Groom mount and pick out hooves with assistance if necessary.
